Turn RIGHT on Paradise Drive and follow it 2.5 miles to the FIRST entrance to the Romberg Tiburon Center, which will be on your left through a large gate (3152 Paradise Drive). Park in any available spot. Follow the signs to the Bay Conference Center.
